



USO DE TERRENO GENERALIZADO: PUERTO RICO, 1977-78





Situation of Urban Forest

- **Rapid urbanization and residential development has resulted in mass reduction of the green spaces.**
- **Urbanization and sprawl is happening into natural areas.**
- **Development has been mostly horizontal, instead of vertical.**

Situation of Urban Forest

Human demands are creating stress in the delicate natural balance of the island's ecosystem, which has already resulted in costly water shortages, flooding, endangerment of habitats of native species and loss of bio-diversity.

PRCES: Urban Forestry and Arboriculture Program

- In 1989, Sponsor by DNRE, the Southern Region of FS made a presentation to launch the Program “America the Beautiful”
- State and Private Program at ITF-FS, 1990
- First Council in urban forestry issues was organized in 1991 and reorganized on September 2003

First 5 years: 1990 - 1995

- **A liaison between DNRE, USFS-IITF, UPR-RUM-CCA, and NGO**
- **Training of trainers in arboriculture and urban forestry**
- **PR and Virgin Island were included in the Southern Chapter of the International Society of Arboriculture**

From 1995 - 2005

- **Training and education program**
 - **Extension Agents**
 - **Seminars and workshop in tree selection, tree planting, maintenance program: pruning and fertilizing**
 - **Personnel from other agencies**
 - **Municipal employees**
 - **Workers of the electric company (PREPA)**



 - Annual Conference
 - Annual awards recognitions to professionals, community groups or individuals
 - Since 2000, alternate between PR and Virgin Island

- All extension agents has been educated on basic knowledge of arboriculture and urban forestry
- The PR Extension Service serve as counselor for DNRE in urban forestry issues

- Planning Board regulations for tree care and planting, “Reglamento 25”, March 16, 1996, review on 1998
- First Urban Forest Law for PR, (213, August 5, 1999)
